Registration: Includes all scheduled activities from Tuesday evening, October 24, through Saturday morning, October 28; lunch on Friday, and dinner on Wednesday. Participants are responsible for transportation, lodging, or meals other than those listed above. There will be ample free time for lunch, dinner & exploring on your own in downtown Bangor.
